

Montessori Inclusion Blog #2: An Interesting Website/ A Great Resource

Resources for us all to share. I know there is a lot of advice around how to make inclusion work. Have you heard about [Inclusion Together](#) ? This document has been created across teams of Inclusive Educators at [Gowrie NSW](#); [Kindergarten Union](#) and [Include Me](#) - Part of Big Fat Smile. The agency is called [Inclusion Agency NSW/ACT](#) .

While this resource is focused on ECE, as someone who works across the whole school from 3-6 to 6-9 and 9-12 in Montessori Classrooms, I think there is something here for everyone who is working in Inclusion roles in EC or in Primary Schools.

Meandering through this webpage can seem quite daunting as there are so many resources. They are, however, colour coded and after spending some time accessing some of the resources, I feel quite at home.

I suggest you start by clicking on one of the coloured circles at the bottom of the home page (of course after reading all the information provided)!

For example the green circle is the [Voices of Children](#) . {Just an aside, any links that you come across in this webpage that are coloured green relate to the child's voice.}

[Families and Carers](#) – the yellow circle shares thoughts on topics such as “Have a shared conversation,” “Find common ground,” “Agree on a path forward” and “Keep connected.”

The Blue Circle has resources and information about education and Care Services. [Education and Care Services](#). It also shares thoughts on “Have a shared conversation,” “Find common ground,” “Agree on a path forward” and “Keep connected.”

The last circle (however not the least important - they are all so important to each other - we can't do one circle without the other as MMPI has shown us true inclusion is working as a team) is red/orange. The [Early Childhood intervention Professionals](#) supports us going on the journey of inclusion with Allied Health Professionals. They too have sections with thoughts on “Have a shared conversation,” “Find common ground,” “Agree on a path forward” and “Keep connected.”

I am sure if you have been exploring this website whilst reading this you will have realised there is a lot of crossover of resources. Quite a few that are in Educators are also in Early Childhood Professionals resources.
